Davis L. Holloway is a human resources professional with over 25 years experience in HR management, education, and training. He is a master instructor for the Center for Leadership Studies in Escondido, CA and also teaches graduate level courses in business at Dallas Baptist University.

A retired United States Air Force officer, Davis started his military career in 1974 as a Korean linguist, received his commission, then became a personnel officer, executive officer, leadership training instructor, director of human resources, and Air Force ROTC instructor.
